GENERAL RULES

1. Exhibitors both commercial, agricultural and concessionaires of all kinds assume all risks of damage or loss either to person or property for all and every cause whatsoever, including fire, the elements, violation of the law, negligence either on the part of the Fauquier County Fair, Inc., its officers, servants, agents or employees, or other person or persons and it is further expressly understood and agreed between the exhibitors and Fauquier County Fair, Inc. that the said Fauquier County Fair, Inc. incurs no liability or obligation to the exhibitors, other than to permit the exhibitor to use the grounds, buildings, or tents for exhibits.
2. NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ALLOWED ON PREMISES.
3. Exhibitors must go to school, be employed by or own a business, based in Fauquier County or be a resident of or a property owner in Fauquier County or be a member of a Fauquier County 4-H, FFA, or FHA program.
4. Classes will be offered in the following age divisions. Age as of September 30, 2025:
 - Pre-Junior: 8 years and under
 - Junior: 9 to 13 years
 - Senior: 14 to 19 years
 - Adult: Over 19 years
5. Exhibitors in the 4-H, FFA and FHA competition must be a currently enrolled member and be 9 to 19 years old to compete in the 4-H, FFA and FHA categories. All other exhibitors will compete in the open competition regardless of age.
6. Fauquier County Fair Board rules will be in effect. The decisions of the judges are final. The Fair Board reserves the right of final ruling in cases of conflict between exhibitors and fair staff.
7. Please be advised that all rules will be enforced and if violations occur, exhibitors could be asked to leave, forfeit their premiums and entry fees, or suspended from showing in future years. Participating in this event is at your own risk and that of the health of your animals.
8. As a condition of exhibiting at the Fauquier County Fair, the exhibitor authorizes the Fauquier County Fair to use any photographs from the event for future publication.
9. Department Superintendents may enter exhibits in their own Departments, but neither they nor any other exhibitor may communicate with the judges during the time of determining the awards, except to answer questions proposed by the judge.
10. Exhibitors must comply with the rules and instructions in this catalog. The Department Superintendent reserves the right to refuse any application for entry of an exhibit. No exhibits will be accepted without the exhibitor's complete address and phone number.
11. All entries not removed on **Sunday, July 19, 2026 between 12:00 pm and 3:00 pm** will become the property of the Fauquier County Fair Board – no exceptions.
12. Fauquier County Fair will put forth its best effort to pay premiums Thursday, Friday, and Saturday during specific windows during the fair if you are in attendance AND also on Sunday when entries are to be picked up. Times will be listed on the building door during the fair and on the website.
13. The fair will be open to the public on Wednesday, July 15, 2026 and will close on Saturday, July 18, 2026.
14. All vehicles must be removed from the barn and vendor area no later than 12:00 pm Wednesday through Friday, and 8:00 am Saturday. Vehicles will only be allowed in this area for no longer than 30 minutes, for drop-off purposes only. Vehicles will be towed if parked in this area for longer than 30 minutes.

15. The online catalog is the final for all rules, regulations and classes.

EXHIBIT BUILDING RULES

Please read through this catalog and be certain to check each division, section and class for any changes in rules, specifications or limitations.

1. Entries must have been made or produced by the exhibitor after July 14, 2025.
2. **All exhibit building entries will be accepted on Monday, July 13, 2026 from 3:00pm until 7:30pm and Tuesday, July 14, 2026 from 8:00am to 10:30am at the fairgrounds. Entries must be registered through the FairEntry website in advance. If you are struggling with creating a FairEntry account, please email us at fauquierfair@gmail.com and we can arrange to have someone help you in advance.**
3. Professionals will only be allowed to participate in the professional classes which are listed in each applicable section. There will be no premiums paid (Rosettes will be given). If only one entry in a class, the judge, at his discretion, does not need to award a first place. A professional is defined as: One who participates in any activity from which he/she receives a source of income from the sale of said activity or in which he/she instructs. Professionals will not be eligible for Best in Show awards.
4. In case of a tie for trophies or awards, the highest number of blue ribbons will determine the winner.
5. The Fair Board reserves the right to combine classes when there are less than four entries in a class.
6. Refrigeration will NOT be available.
7. ONLY ONE ENTRY PER CLASS. Only one like item per exhibitor (i.e. a decorated basket cannot be entered in both the decorated basket class AND Misc. Craft class).
8. Entries may be used by Fair Board for future publication.
9. Blue Ribbons to be awarded in Pre-Junior & Junior divisions, Senior & Adult divisions are based on merit.
10. Exhibitors must reside in Fauquier County.
11. **All entries in Exhibit Building are to remain in place until Sunday, July 19, 2026. Entries MUST be picked up on Sunday, July 19th between 12:00 pm and 3:00 pm. If an exhibit is removed prior to this time, exhibitor shall forfeit his or her premiums. Entries not collected during this time frame will be disposed of. If you are unable to pick up your items, please arrange for a friend or family member to retrieve them during the posted time. There will be NO alternative pickup times.**

HOW TO USE FAIR ENTRY

- 1) Exhibit registration is done only via the FairEntry website. You must complete this process at home in order to allow for your tags to be printed. If you have questions or need help with this process, please reach out **prior to fair week**.
- 2) If this is your first year attending our fair, you will first create your account on fairentry.com (you can access this through our website as well)
- 3) If you entered items last year, log into your FairEntry account.
- 4) Once into your account, you will register all items you plan on entering. Please double check to ensure you have entered them into the appropriate classes

THE DEBBIE CORNWELL BUILDING EXHIBITOR AWARD

This award along with \$100 is given to the exhibitor with the most points overall in building exhibits. Debbie was a past fair board officer and a major force in setting up and running the Exhibit Building for many years. In honor of her hard work and dedication to the fair, the Fair Board will be presenting this award in her honor.

THE PATTY KORTLANDT AWARD

This award along with \$50 is given to the youth with the highest points in both Food Preparation and Food Preservation Departments. Patty was a long-time judge and volunteer who gave countless hours and support to the fair. This award is given in her honor.

THE NIC KORTLANDT AWARD

This award along with \$50 is given to the Junior exhibitor with the highest points in Fruits & Vegetables. Nic was a long-time supporter and friend of the fair. This award is given in his honor.

THE H.W. ARMSTRONG, JR. AWARD

This award along with \$50 is given to the Junior exhibitor with the highest points in Woodworking. Mr. Armstrong is a longtime friend of the fair and has a love for woodworking. In his honor, the Armstrong and Woodward Family have designed this award and generously sponsor this award.

THE DEBBIE PEARSON HOYSA MEMORIAL AWARD

This award along with \$50 is given to the Senior exhibitor with the most points in Crafts. Debbie was an exhibitor for several years in the exhibit building and later a volunteer in the set-up and organization of the building exhibits. This award is given in her memory for her participation and support of the Fauquier County Fair.

THE CHEATWOOD FAMILY MEMORIAL AWARD

This award along with \$50 is given to the Junior exhibitor with the most points in Baked Goods. Annie Rose was a major competitor at the fair each year with a real talent in baking. This award is given in memory of Annie's gentle spirit. It was inspired by her desire to bring joy to all at the Fauquier County Fair.

THE BRONI LAMBELET ART AWARD

This award along with \$50 is given to the Junior exhibitor with the most points in Fine Arts. It is given in memory of Broni Lambelet and her great love and support for the Fauquier County Fair.

THE CAROL ELGIN AWARD

This award is given to the Senior exhibitor with the most points accumulated with blue and red ribbons in the Flowers, Plants & Arrangements Department. Carol was a Fauquier County horticulture teacher, FFA Sponsor and a life member of The Future Farmers of America. Her contagious enthusiasm and encouragement motivated many to pursue their interest

in horticulture and agriculture. This perpetual award is given in memory of Carol Chick Elgin and is donated by her dear friend Palma Smoot and friends.

THE ELEANOR HAZEL ARTS & CRAFTS AWARD AND THE ELEANOR BROWER SEWING AWARD

The Eleanor Hazel Crafts Award is given to the 4-H exhibitor with the most points in Crafts; and the Eleanor Brower Sewing Award is given to the 4-H exhibitor with the most points in Sewing. These awards are based on the most points accumulated with blue and red ribbons. A tie is decided by number of blue ribbons. Upon the dissolution of the Liberty 76'ers 4-H Club, the 4-H'ers wanted to honor these devoted former 4-H leaders who gave so much to the youth of the county and to the Fauquier Junior Fair. Recipient must be an enrolled 4-H member exhibiting in the Crafts or Sewing Department.

THE MAYBELLE OSBORNE SMITH
MEMORIAL AWARD

This award, along with \$50 is given to the junior exhibitor with the most points in jams and jellies. Maybelle was a 4-H leader in Fauquier County as well as a judge at county fairs in the region. She had a passion for preserving traditions and passing along the time proven skills of preparing jams and jellies in her kitchen.
